EXTENSIONS

When you add two or more letters to the beginning (front extension) or end (back extension) or both sides (double extension) of a word, it is called an extension. For example, the word JUMP can be front extended to LONGJUMP and OUTJUMP. It can be back extended to JUMPABLE, JUMPING, JUMPED, JUMPER, JUMPIER, JUMPIEST, JUMPILY, JUMPOFF and JUMPSUIT.

PHONEYS
